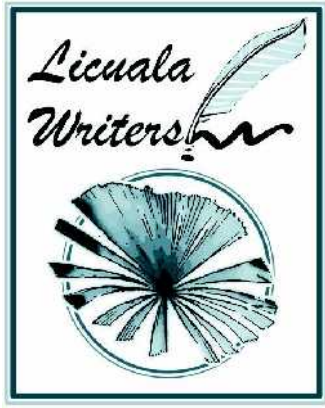

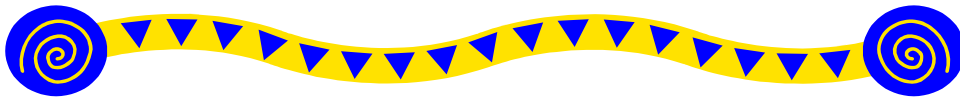

ARTISTS PROFILES JOHN & MIM BATES



JOHN BATES

Warm glass represents the start of yet another journey. As one who has used his hands from the very beginning to work with timber and metals, John's capture at this late stage of his life by warm glass was not a great surprise, as it requires considerable understanding of the application of heat, and the effects of thermal expansion. It was also of considerable help that his training in the electrical trades was just the thing when he needed to build a kiln.

During the last 40 years of his life, John has been heavily associated with painting and sculpture through the activities of his wife Mim and his daughters Linda and Debra.

This period saw the staging of at least 5 major art exhibitions in Grafton and Ingham, with his main involvement being the setup and lighting. Of course John was also involved in things like picture framing and preparing exhibits. His one venture as an artist was undertaken strictly as a joke, after he had commented that anyone could produce paintings equivalent to those on display at a major exhibition put on by the Grafton City Council. Much to his surprise, his painting sold, albeit at a reduced, negotiated price! Satisfactory as this outcome was, John felt no need at all to continue with painting. His major occupation during his time in Grafton was the construction of a 45 foot sailing boat in his backyard. The eventual launching of this boat led to a period of 6 years when he spent as much time on the Great Barrier Reef as he spent ashore, and it was this period of fishing and diving that led to his admiration for, and familiarity with, the creatures that live on the reef. John hopes that his admiration of these creatures will show through in some of his works in glass. The development of techniques using rotation of glass at high temperatures in the kiln has added a new dimension of shape to his work as shown in his deep vases and bowls.

John's life since moving to Forrest Beach has involved building two houses plus all the furnishings, and the renewal of his love affair with motor bikes. However, motor bikes could not compete with the challenges of warm glass. John is now completely involved with the possibilities that lie before him and the motor bike has been moved onto someone who will use it.

MIM BATES

In 1969, while living in Grafton, Mim began painting, concentrating on traditional works. Her subjects cover a diverse range and include landscapes, seascapes, still life, birds and flowers. While sometimes working with watercolours, acrylics and pen & wash, oils remain her favourite medium. Mim is self taught and has had 2 solo exhibitions and 5 exhibitions in conjunction with other artists.

Over the years Mim has exhibited in combined art shows organised by the art clubs where she was living at the time.

Mim finally settled in Allingham in 1984 and has entered the annual Hinchinbrook Art Competition since 1987 with some success, achieving 2 firsts, 8 Highly Commended and a popular vote over the years. Mim started doing clay sculpture 2 years ago, making small whimsical pieces and Australian animals. Recently Mim tried her hand at crystal glazes but she feels she still has a lot to learn in this field. Meanwhile Mim is finding working with clay lots of fun.
